Man is inquisitive. He studies nature. This study of nature gives him knowledge. He arranges that knowledge systematically. Such a systematic arrangement of knowledge about nature is called Science. For example, Physics, Botany and Geology are Sciences. We study them in schools and colleges.

We apply these sciences to increase our comfort. Our comforts are various. We live in houses, travel by buses and read in electric lights. Hence houses, buses and electric lights are our comforts. We apply some parts of the sciences in house-building, some in machine-making and some others in producing electric lamps. These parts of the sciences are called Applied Sciences.

Engineering needs the laws of Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry. Applied Sciences deal with these laws. Applied Physics provides information about forces, whereas Applied Chemistry tells us about the materials. Thus Applied Science form the basis for the study or primeering.

Engineering involves the productive and purposeful use of the sciences. It is also called Technology. A chemist studies the elements in Nature; he is a Scientist. When he applies his scientific knowledge to produce synthetic products and medicines, he becomes a Technologist. Thus technology is the purposeful use of the knowledge of materials and sources of energy. Therefore, it is an essential part of modern life.

Science and Technology are complementary to each other. Science concerns natural objects and occurrences, technology, man-made products. As science breaks up the natural world for the purpose of understanding, it is analytical Technology on the other hand arranges natural materials in a different order; it is synthetical. Science provides basic information for technology. The latter provides better conditions for the former's development. Science provides a systematic body of knowledge but technology offers an instrument to use that knowledge.


