Helen Keller :

Helen Keller, when she was 18 months old, was stricken with a disease that robbed her of the ability to see and hear. But against overwhelming odds, she waged a slow and steady but successful battle to re-enter the world of the normal people. The child grew into a highly intelligent and sensitive woman who wrote, spoke and laboured incessantly for the cause of the world in general and physically challenged in particular. Helen was born in Tuscumbia, Alabama, Usa June 27, 1880. When she was about 6 years old, her parents appealed to Alexander Grahambell-an authority on teaching speech to the deaf and the dumb- for counsel regarding her education. As a result Anne Mansfield Sullivan trained in teaching such children, came to stay with Helen as her teacher. Sullivan then twenty years old, was blind once but who had partially regained her vision was a graduate of Perkins school for the blind at Boston. Both of them took to each other instantaneously and remained inseparable till Anne's death.
